HSA Event Summaries and Volunteers Opportunities

Below are descriptions of many of the social and fundraising events we will be running this year, as well as explanations of where volunteer help is needed. Parent's Night Out and Auction

Wear jeans or your favorite cocktail dress and join us for a fun night out for parents as we raise funds for our wonderful school! The "Silver & Gold Soiree" will be held in March in the "Saber's Den." There will be live and silent auctions, raffles, delicious food and drinks, and a DJ & dancing.

There will be a special event committee that holds meetings throughout the year for this event. There will be many opportunities to help out!

Cherrydale Catalog Fundraiser

The first major fundraiser of the school year is a catalog-based fundraiser run through Cherrydale Fund Raising. There is something for everyone with items such as wrapping paper, home decor, kitchen gadgets, candy & nuts, cookie dough, pies & cakes, candles, and lots more. There are also fun incentives to get the students excited to sell!

For this fundraiser, we need help distributing items to families when they are delivered to the school in early November. Typically we have several parent volunteers organize and distribute orders to families during afternoon pick-up.

Scholastic Book Fair

Our week-long Scholastic book fair is held in September in the school gym. Children can preview the books and then return to shop the following days. The fair is also open during the evenings of "Meet the Teachers" nights for parents to shop with their children. Proceeds from the sale of books at this event will fund the purchase of new books for the SJS library and the classrooms.

Volunteers are needed to help set-up the fair and to help students as they visit the book fair each day.

Grandparents' and Special Persons' Day

This annual tradition is a wonderful way for students in grades K-5 to share a morning with a grandparent or special person. Guests are honored at a ceremony in the gym where students share poems, skits, and songs and also enjoy a concert by the school band. Following the ceremony, guests visit the classrooms.

Prior to the event, volunteers are needed to help plan and coordinate the event and assemble raffle baskets. The morning of the event, volunteers assist in set-up, greeting guests, serving refreshments and clean-up.

Halloween Trunk or Treat

Students in all grades and their families are invited for some Halloween fun! Come in costume and decorate your trunk! Enjoy a costume parade, trunk or treating, a “tricked-out trunk” contest, yummy treats, dancing, games and a lot of fun!

Volunteers are needed to help plan, set up/clean up and help out at the event.

Christmas Store

In early December, the school Gym is transformed into a shopping plaza for a day. Each class has an allotted time during which children may shop for and purchase inexpensive items for their family. Every year our students are so excited to pick out something special for their loved ones and family members love unwrapping their special gifts on Christmas morning.

Volunteers are needed to set-up/clean-up the store and help during the school day as students shop.

Family Fun Nights

Several times throughout the year we will be hosting “family fun nights” to provide families with the opportunity to come together for some fun and socializing. Every event will have a different theme such as candy bar BINGO, dance party, minute-to-win-it games, sports fun, or “potluck & play.” Join in the fun!

Volunteers are needed to help plan, set-up, run and clean-up the events.

Middle School Dances

There are 2 dances for the middle school students of St. James and St. Bridget schools. This is a great way for our older students to have fun and meet up with friends.

For the dance hosted by SJS, six parents are needed to set-up, monitor behavior, and assist with refreshments. For the dances not held at SJS, two parents are needed to assist with sign in/sign out.

Mother & Daughter Tea

In May, girls in all grades may invite mom or a special lady in their life to a Spring tea party. Tea & lemonade, tea sandwiches & treats, crafts & games and lots of fun make this event a great way to share some special “girl time!”

Volunteers are needed prior to the event to help prepare food and decorations and organize activities and crafts. The day before and the day of the party, we need volunteers to set-up, serve and clean-up.

Father & Daughter Dance

Our annual Father/Daughter dance is traditionally held in the spring and features an evening of DJ music, games, dancing, and snacks. Attire for girls is dressy and attire for dads is office casual (keep in mind it can get quite warm in the gym).

Volunteers are needed to help organize food, games and decorations in advance. At the event, moms are needed to help set-up, oversee and clean-up.

Dine-Out Nights

Every month a local restaurant hosts SJS families and donates a percentage of the evening's sales back to our school. This is a fun way to meet up with friends for dinner and tasty way support our school!

Staff Appreciation Luncheon

This special luncheon is a way for SJS parents to show their appreciation to the teachers and staff for all the help and support they give our children during the year. Staff are treated to a delicious luncheon hosted at the school for all staff members.

Parents are needed to help prepare the daily treats for parents, watch the children in the classrooms (from 12:00-1:30) the day of the lunch, and to set-up, serve and clean-up the lunch.

HSA GIVES

HSA GIVES (Get Involved, Value Everyone, Share) is a way to help the school and church communities reach out to the local community. We will be organizing several activities over the year to help improve the lives of those around us. Some ideas include Christmas caroling at assisted-living facilities, making/delivering sandwiches to MACC, and collecting items for food pantries and homeless shelters.

Volunteers will be needed to organize various activities.

Father/Son Event

Get all the guys together! This event is a great way for SJS boys to have some fun with dad or any special man in their lives. This year the event will occur at Dave & Busters. We are always open to new ideas so please share any you may have!

Mother/Son Event

Every year we organize an event for moms and sons to share some special time. In the past we have attended a Wolf Pack hockey game, UConn Basketball game, and enjoyed kickball, pizza & swimming at Star Hill Athletic Center.
